A Christmas Story

I had a long and unsuccessful drinking career. I started drinking occasionally in high school and would get drunk whenever I drank. By the time I was in college, I drank every weekend, blacking out every time I drank. Like many of us, I chose to associate with others who drank like I did so my drinking behavior would seem "normal." My circle of friends and goals in life shrank to fit my drinking.

From my functioning alcoholic family, I learned how to hide my devastating disease. I graduated from college and was able to hold good jobs. I married (an alcoholic, of course), lived in a nice house, drove nice cars and belonged to a country club. But, I hated my life. I lived in a continual state of floating anxiety, passing out every night, waking up wondering what I had done the night before. Many mornings would bring memories that made me cringe. Looking in the mirror, I would see my red puffy eyes and veins on my face. I eventually went to see a psychiatrist to find out what was wrong with me, and he suggested I go to AA. I was miserable so I went. I went to meetings and tried to stop drinking, but I couldn't.

One Christmas Eve, I sat at my kitchen table drinking wine with the load of my miserable world on my shoulders. I just couldn't bear to have any more Christmas Eves as miserable as that one I was having. I put my head in my hands, and said, "Help me."

That was my last drink. My sobriety date is December 25 th, 1987. Whenever I think that I don't need to practice all of the principles of our program or do everything I've been told to do to stay sober, I remember that Christmas Eve.

Thank you all for being here for me.
